#### **Observations and General Discussion**

- Alan D: Read an article with the wrong constellation for M33
- Rodger C: Took a series of photos showing the motion of Venus, Mars and Jupiter on October 7<sup>t</sup>, 10<sup>th</sup>, 17<sup>th</sup>, 19<sup>th</sup>, 23<sup>rd</sup>, 29<sup>th</sup>, 31<sup>st</sup>, and November 3<sup>rd</sup>. Jupiter and Mars moved closer to each other from October 7<sup>th</sup> to the 19<sup>th</sup>. On October 23<sup>rd</sup>, Jupiter passed Mars. After November 23<sup>rd</sup>, Jupiter Mars and Venus lined up and the closest approach of Jupiter and Mars was on November 3<sup>rd</sup>. Roger then measured coordinates of these 3 stars and then use software to plot the western elongation of Venus from the Sun for 2015. The observed arc visible in the series of photos is due to angles of view and not retrograde motion.

- Gary W: Denton Mirror coating in Cherry Hill. Only commercial one for now
- Jim F: Talked about a scope made from an RAF 6.3 inch lens and about F18
